

• Future 4 Youth

The Future4Youth project is committed to creating positive and peaceful societies for young people in the Western Balkans by advocating for violence prevention, gender equality, life skills, and health education in schools. With a regional platform of organizations, YMI has implemented the Program Y methodology to prevent interpersonal and gender-based violence and promote gender equality and healthy lifestyles. The program has shown positive changes in attitudes towards violence among youth who have participated. The initiative is based on addressing gender inequalities and promoting healthy lifestyles to enable boys and girls, young men and women, to reach their full potential on their path to adulthood. With solid support from the community and a collective approach, YMI aims to create sustainable change for a better future

Youth for Inclusion, Equality, and Trust

This project aims to empower young Albanians, Serbs, Roma, Ashkali, and Egyptians to challenge social stereotypes and think creatively through non-formal education training in critical and creative thinking. Trained participants will become multipliers and spread their skills and experience to others. SIT will hold capacity-building activities related to the media, advocacy, and human rights in six municipalities and develop a toolkit for peacebuilding and for non-formal and formal education that combat prejudices and stereotypes using various methods such as the art of hosting facilitation, non-violent communication, and formal educators, and the Ministry of Education, Science, Technology, and Innovation will be involved in the development process. The project will also create reports and stories on sensitive topics such as gender equality and social cohesion.

Counseling for Prevention 3.0

The "Counseling for Prevention" project is a bold initiative to prevent violence against women and girls by working with perpetrators of domestic and gender-based violence. By piloting counseling sessions and working with public institutions and NGOs, the project hopes to drive changes in legislation and promote effective psycho-social programs for perpetrators in Kosovo. The project also seeks to raise awareness of the role of men in combating DV and GBV and assess the currently available programs for working with perpetrators. With the support of UNFPA, SIT is leading the charge in promoting a safer and more just society for women and girls in Kosovo.



(2023 - Present)

The MasterPeace Global Network and CSOs working with youth in the Balkans, Middle East, and Western EU are teaming up to address social inclusion, climate dilemmas, and lack of job prospects for young people. We aim to develop innovative non-formal education formats to engage, connect, and empower young people, especially women in rural areas. The project aims to create a digital and scalable portfolio of NFE materials, train youth workers to use them, and build an ecosystem of CSOs and young people to act as an accelerator for sustainable change. The project will engage, connect, and empower 75% of young women and 30% from minority backgrounds through online courses, social entrepreneurship challenges, thematic NFE handbooks, and Great Minds Meetings. Ultimately, the project aims to run 25 projects involving 200 young people to create a more inclusive and sustainable future.

Youth Voices, Youth Choices

The "Youth Voices, Youth Choices" project is a 30-month initiative to improve sexual and reproductive health services and information accessibility for young people (age 14-30) in the Western Balkan region. Through a youth-centered approach, the project will gather information about young people's SRH needs during the COVID-19 crisis, especially for those living in remote areas and in unfavorable social conditions. The project will empower young people to advocate for their SRH needs and increase policy and decision-makers' commitment to friendly and accessible SRH services and information. The project is managed by the IPPF European Network, implemented by regional partners, and supported by the Merck for Mothers Global Giving Program.



Poke the Bubble

(2023 - Present)

This project aims to empower local youth work CSO professional groups in Serbia and Kosovo to effectively engage young people from the region in promoting good neighborhood relations through addressing issues of mutual importance, specifically focusing on gender equality. The project has two specific objectives: (1) to establish a network of CSO professional groups from Serbia and Kosovo to implement innovative youth work outreach methodologies in addressing gender equality with young men and women from underdeveloped areas, and (2) to create opportunities for young people from underdeveloped urban and rural areas in Serbia and Kosovo to take a proactive approach in addressing gender roles, norms, gender equality, and other youth-related themes at all community levels. Through these objectives, the project seeks to build the capacities of local CSOs to become independent and accountable actors while promoting youth empowerment and community engagement.

Peace through Art

(2023 - Present)

This project uses the power of art to promote peace in Kosovo by advocating for collective reconciliation between communities and helping individuals overcome trauma linked to conflict. It addresses various social issues, including youth inclusion, peacebuilding, interethnic dialogue, gender equality, domestic and gender-based violence, and youth employment and representation. By bringing youth together, engaging them in community work, and raising awareness about these issues, the project aims to promote active citizenship and advocacy for youth rights locally and nationally. Collaborative art projects establish strong connections between participants and generate a will for peace in the community. Using social issues and promoting peacebuilding in Kosovo.

- Impact and Success Stories

- The first counseling center in Kosovo to work with perpetrators of gender-based and domestic violence
- Its peacebuilding programs have brought together young people from different communities in Kosovo
- It operates the only platform for peacebuilding and reconciliation: www.sitandbreaktheice.org
- SIT's youth programs, including the accredited Program Y, have targeted a large number of young people in Kosovo
- SIT is based in Prishtina but also works in smaller municipalities and has partnerships with local, national, and international organizations
- The Be a Man Club has helped many young men and boys change their violent behavior
- SIT has launched three large campaigns, including Father's Festival, Youth Festival, and The Last Tunnel, to address social issues in Kosovo SIT's success stories demonstrate the transformative power of peace and tolerance
- Research done focused on DV and GBV, perpetrator programs in Kosovo, Sexual and Reproductive Health during the COVID-19 Pandemic, Youth Attitudes towards peer violence, attitudes of youth on men and masculinity
- Many topics have been the focus of the Research Department, publishing a total of 22 research reports and 15 Green Reports.

The programs implemented within the work with perpetrators are:

- 1.A program for working with men who used violence in intimate partner relationships (Eng/Alb)
- 2. Training for counselors of violent boys and men (Alb)
- 3. Manual for work with domestic violence perpetrators in Kosovo (Eng/Alb)
- 4. Labor Service Standards working with perpetrators in Kosovo (Shqip)
- 5. Respectful Relationships (group counseling) for perpetrators

Within the Social Services department, SIT has implemented a total of 14 projects on several topics: Youth Activism, Interethnic Reconciliation, and Human Rights and Gender Equality.
